Content Developments

P01 developments

4160 concepts added in the past year

6000 CAS numbers have been added since June 2015

A 'clean' chemical semantic model has been implemented to provide the 'one-armed bandit' back office for chemical substances

- Includes a 'substance' wheel mapped to ChEBI and CAS (S27 vocabulary)
- Population is a work in progress
- 'Bandit' tool still needs to be developed





Technical Developments

Enhanced service resilience

- There has been a worrying increase in down time due to security (patch application) and other issues in the NOC Liverpool server room
- The proposed solution is multi-node serving through a load-balancing service
- JASMIN (RAL) and NOC Southampton have been identified as suitable sites for mirror nodes
- BUT
- Vocabulary server is back-ended by Oracle
- Multiple-user (CPU power-based) licences required
- VERY expensive, especially for a large VM farm like JASMIN





Technical Developments

Enhanced service resilience alternative strategy

- Replicated SPARQL endpoints
 - Overnight cron deconstructs Oracle database into triples
 - Triples stored in a Fuseki database
 - Database replicated across nodes using RSYNC
- Oracle database used for maintenance
- Server APIs and search client run off the SPARQL endpoints





Technical Developments

NVS Search Client (Internet Explorer prior to IE10 not supported)

- Developed in addition to the Maris client because
 - Requirement for control over search behaviour to reduce number of hits
 - Requirement to manage exclusion of deprecated concepts
 - Requirement for tools running off the SPARQL endpoint rather than the Oracle database
 - Requirement for a client to access vocabularies in NVS other than those deemed to be of interest to SeaDataNet
